



A Tribute: Henry Bethé Achieves Grand Life Master (LM) Rank

Henry started his bridge career flat on his back during a bout of Asian flu in 1957 when a friend gave him a copy of Goren's "Point Count Complete". He devoured the book and it profoundly affected the rest of his life. After playing some bridge during his remaining years in prep school, Henry was introduced by Dorothy Fuchs to duplicate at the Ithaca Bridge Club in the summer of 1960. He won his first Master Points (MPs) in his second game. Unlike many of his contemporaries elsewhere, he did not let bridge get in the way of school, but when he dropped out of Cornell he found release in the local bridge scene.

Cornell University and Ithaca had terrific players then, including Jeff Rubens, Bob Ewen, Walter May and Dick Lesser. All of them were generous in his training! Henry's bridge career was interrupted for the next four years by bouts of work, school, and illness. But in the spring of 1965 he convinced Tom Smith, then a Cornell student, to go with him to Toronto for the Canadian Nationals Regional. They had fewer than 100 MPs total and had not played together before, but they miraculously won the huge Open Pairs, virtually doubling their MPs.

In the fall of 1965 Henry entered the University of Wisconsin. Again, there was a strong bridge community, including Richard Katz, Larry Cohen, Mike Ledeen and later Ron Andersen. With bridge as a minor, Henry made LM in the spring of 1966 (LM #5997) and finished 4th in the summer LM Pairs. However, his best result during the Madison years was at the Fall Nationals in 1968. There he won the LM Men's Pairs (with John Solodar) and added 5th in the Blue Ribbon Pairs and 4th in the Reisinger Teams to win the Herman Trophy for the best overall performance.

In 1969 Henry left Madison for NYC and spent the next few years as an active bridge player and teacher. He also became a tournament director, working weekends at many regionals, after playing during the week, and was recruited for the Nationals Appeals Committee.

Henry began work in 1972, eventually joining Chase Manhattan Bank in 1975 doing mainly financial trouble-shooting, and they supported his getting an MBA at Columbia in 1981. His bridge became much less active, even more so when he married Kitty Munson in 1976. But Henry still went to most nationals, and with Chuck Lamprey finished in the top 10 of every LM pairs from 1974 to 1981. He also reached the finals of every Reisinger teams he entered during this period, with 3rd his highest overall finish.

In 1985 Henry's job sent him to England. There he won several events and represented England in the 1987 European Pairs Championship. More important to him, though, was the progress of his wife Kitty, who was selected for the British Ladies Team in the 1987 European Championships, taking the Bronze Medal. The Bethés returned to the US in 1987, and celebrated by teaming up with Alan and Dorothy Truscott to win the six-session North American Swiss. In 1989 Henry was coach of the winning US Women's Venice Trophy Team which included Kitty. In the spring of 1991 Henry won his 3rd NABC event, the National Open Pairs with Larry Mori.

In 1993 Henry retired from business and returned to Ithaca. He has been very active (directing, doing statistics, etc.) in the Ithaca Bridge Club, serving as president for the past four years. He has also been a member of the Unit 112 Board including serving as president. His bridge activity has been mainly local but in the 1999 Syracuse Regional, Henry, with his son Paul, Varis Carey and Steve and Betty Bloom won the Prime Time KO-2 and the Flight A/X Swiss. Afterwards, Paul was heard to say "Bridge is an easy game"! Henry won his 10,000th point where he won his first, in a club game in Ithaca, which, with any one of his three national wins, qualified him for Grand Life Master.

Henry's limited more recent NABC's still have produced a 2nd in the National Open Pairs in 2001 and a 3rd in the Blue Ribbon pairs in 2003, both with Varis Carey, who got his PhD in Mathematics at Cornell University. Also, Henry had a 4th and a 6th in the Open Board-a-Match.

Henry was on the ACBL National Board of Governors for two three-year terms. He continues to serve on National Appeals and is a member of the Conventions and Competitions Committee as well as the Conditions Committees for both the Open and Senior International Trials. Among his other contributions are various aspects of the master point plan, including silver points, and a revision to Victory Point Scales currently in use in the International Trials. He has also written for several bridge publications, including being the current director of the District4Spot Master Solvers Club.

Article of Interest
Damn Computer Hands
(By Michael Spitulnik, Rochester)

Now that we have computer generated hands at our club games, we have someone else other than our partner to blame for a bad day at the bridge table. We all know computers are diabolical. Why else do they crash at the most inopportune times? And anyone who says these weird hands are completely random and not manipulated to try our patience and test our sanity is ignoring the obvious. The other day I opened a 13-point hand with five spades to the nine, and found my left hand opponent with six spades headed by the ace through the ten. On the next hand I trumped the second round of clubs only to get over ruffed. You can't tell me that some evil force is not responsible!

Yet, as much as I would like to believe there is some sort of conspiracy, I have to admit the evidence is merely circumstantial. The ACBL adamantly maintains its innocence. Random deals are generated by the computer, seen only by the computer operator and the print shop manager. Neither is a bridge player according to the ACBL. No deal is discarded. Hand records are then sealed and stored in a warehouse. If this doesn't impress you, the ACBL informs us that the random number generator uses a linear congruential algorithm that will repeat after 2 to the 47 th power ($140,737,488,355,328$) deals have been generated.

Why then do these computer generated hands, on average, seem different from the hands we see when we shuffle and deal the cards? It is because we don't adequately shuffle and the resulting hands are less than random.

Typically, when we finish playing the last board at a bridge game, we slide our hand together and put it back in the rack. Let's say, for example, the last hand was played in four spades. A heart is led at trick one, won by declarer who then draws trump in three rounds. After the hand is over and the cards are slid together, the 13th card in each hand is a heart, (the first card that was played). The 11th and 12th cards are spades. The 10th card in three out of four hands is also a spade. When we shuffle these cards for the next game we put two of the hands together in one stack of 26 and the other two hands in a second stack. We riffle shuffle them once and if it is a perfect shuffle (every other card mixed), the bottom two cards are hearts and the five or six preceding cards are spades. This same sequence is found half way through the deck. We then split the cards again into two groups of about 26 cards. If our riffle is perfect and we split the cards into equal size groups of 26, the bottom four cards will be hearts and the preceding 10 cards will be spades. Dealt one card at a time, each hand gets a heart and two or three spades. In the play of most hands, we follow suit more than 50% of the time, so this non-random clustering is repeated throughout the deck, resulting in flat hands. Of course, our riffles are not perfect, and we shuffle more than twice, so this is an extreme example. But, you get the picture.

In fact, Harry Freeman examined 1336 hands played in club games and published the results in English Bridge. He found that 372 hands had a 4,4,3,2 distribution where the expected number is 288, a 29% variation. There were 38 hands with a seven-card suit whereas the expected number for truly random is 53, also a 29% variation. There were 38 hands with voids, with an expected number of 68, a whopping 44% variation.

However, probability theory is a tricky thing and on any given day anything can happen -- more accurately, will happen. On one recent Monday at our club game, of the 36 boards, 10 hands had voids, 12 had seven card suits and there were deals with eight and nine card suits. That is when we shake our heads and moan about "computer deals." But, by the end of the week, (six sessions, 864 hands) the percentage of hands with voids and seven-card suits was exactly as expected, 5% and 4%.

For those of you fascinated with numbers, here is some additional trivia you can use to bore your non-bridge friends. The number of possible bridge hands is 635,013,559,600. The probability of getting a 13-card suit is 6.29 exponent minus 12. The most common distribution at 0.2155 probability is 4,4,3,2 followed by 5,3,3,2 at 0.1551 probability. The mundane 4,3,3,3 distribution comes in a lowly 5th at 0.1054. The total number of possible deals is 53,644,737,765,488,792,839,237,440,000 or 53 octillion!
