



President's Message:

Your Board of Directors has named the Rainbow Tournament Open Pairs game the "Robert E. Cofer, III Barometer Pairs" in memory of Bob and his contributions to our Unit. The first winners were Mary Miller and Arlene Bristol.

District 4 is trying a new format for the North American Pairs Flight C which allows clubs to run a STaC competition for the District 4 championship. As in prior years, Flight B will compete at two sites on October 13th. One site will be Lakeville, NY and the other will be Wilmington, DE. Both sites are running a Flight C game as well as a Flight B game. Clubs that feel their players will not travel to the Lakeville or Wilmington Flight C games are encouraged to hold the game locally. Conditions of contest include prescribed pre-dealt hands, two sessions with 24 boards, at least five tables, and all players being pre-qualified, at a club game during June, July and August.

Our web page www.abclunit112.org is averaging 56 hits per day which is similar to the early experience of the RABA web page. Today the RABA site (www.rababridge.org) averages 587 hits per day. Tell us what you would like to see. We are working on archiving the history of our trophies along with their requirements. We have begun a tournament page with results posted. These are available from ACBL but are easier to get to on our calendar limited to tournaments of interest to Unit 112.

Award certificates for Ace of Clubs have been mailed. Medals for the Mini-McKenney awards are ready to be mailed and the awards for Silver Life Master and above are waiting for volunteers to distribute the pins to winners in their area. Please call me and let me know if you can help with any of these projects.

To the Editor:

In a column in the recent *District 4 Spot*, Marti Ronemus reviewed a series of "welcoming measures" for novices. This included, in particular, a promise that "we'll treat you royally" when it comes to tournaments. I worry, though, about "follow through" on this last promise.

I refer, of course, to the behavior of a very few of our top players at tournaments. In between the times our newest players are "novices" and the time they become "bridge veterans," many qualify as "inexperienced tournament players." Having led pre-tournament bridge lessons myself I can attest to the formidable nature of the convention card for some of our "non-veterans." The *Bulletin* ran a multi-issue series on this matter! Yet too often such players are --- well, "bullied" is the only word for it. I'm not sure whether there's an intimidation tactic at work, but I question the need for a major scene, often involving the director, because a box hasn't been checked or because a rather "advanced" question isn't answered immediately. Many of us have formed a partnership "on the fly" when we've had limited time to work out every eventuality on our convention card.

I'm as aware as anyone of the rights of tournament players to "be informed by their opponents" and to be protected by our directors. Still, I think that using these rights for the purposes of intimidation, or even appearing to do so, will scare some of our newer players right out of our tournaments. In our local area we have quite a few "newcomers", and I'd like to see them develop into "bridge veterans." We depend on them to keep our game and our bridge organizations growing. So, I urge all veteran players to remember that the players to your left and right may not be as experienced as you are!

DESCRIPTIONS OF THE UNIT 112 TROPHIES

Walts Overall Trophy: there is no information available at this time.

The Walts Overall is awarded to the player who accumulates the most points during the year playing in all events at sectionals sponsored by Unit 112 (does not include STaC events).

Matson Pairs Trophy: This trophy is awarded to the player who accumulates the most points during the year playing in pairs' events at sectionals sponsored by Unit 112 (does not include STaC events).

The Matson Pairs is named for Elsie T. Matson of Ithaca, New York. Elsie was the first Culbertson authorized teacher in upstate New York. She was our Unit's first Newsletter Editor. Elsie founded the Ithaca Bridge Club in the early thirties and ran a bridge studio until her death in the late sixties. She gave of her time to the Unit and Ithaca for years. Elsie was secretary/treasurer for more years than one can remember. She used to make trips to small bridge clubs to give pep talks, etc. Elsie was literally Mrs. CNYBA for at least 20 years. She was highly influential in starting the CNYBA and in bringing bridge luminaries such as the Culbertsons and Charles Goren to some of the early tournaments. The Matson Trophy was won for many years by Walter Mays, who lived in Ithaca from the late fifties to about 1967, then moved to Binghamton and subsequently retired to Florida.

McKaig Teams Trophy: This trophy is awarded to the player who accumulates the most points during the year playing in team events at sectionals sponsored by Unit 112 (does not include STaC events).

The McKaig Teams is named for Ruby McKaig of Oswego who was the leading woman player in Upstate New York from the forties to the sixties. Ruby was the first woman from our Unit to win a national event. She, John Cullinan (also from Oswego), Truesdale Clarke of Rochester, and a fourth, who was frequently Judge Henry Hudson of Watertown, dominated CNYBA team events for twenty years. She was one of the best players in the Unit and served on the CNYBA Board as well. Ruby was killed in a car accident on her way back from a sectional when a driver went the wrong way on the super highway they were on and hit them head-on.

Pierce Non-Life Masters Trophy: This is the Non-Life Master Trophy. This trophy is awarded to the player who accumulates the most points during the year in all events sponsored by Unit 112 (does not include STaC events).

The Pierce Life Non-Masters is named for Peter Pierce, a much loved local director from Rochester, New York. When the Unit was reorganized and the "old-timers" were thrown out to allow for a more democratic Unit, he was asked to handle the Rochester area. Peter Pierce was especially good with beginning players. He died of cancer while still relatively young. Peter was a popular person and did a lot for bridge in the Rochester area.

Joseph Non-Masters Trophy: This trophy race is open to all players who began the calendar year with 0-20 masterpoints. It is awarded to the player who accumulates the most points during the year playing in all events (open pairs, teams, 99er, novice and non-life master events) at sectionals sponsored by Unit 112 (does not include STaC events).

The Joseph Non-Masters is named for Bill Joseph, another one of the early leading players in the Unit. Bill was very involved in the Unit giving a great deal of his time to the organization and was a good bridge player. Believed to be from Syracuse, Bill Joseph was especially good with beginning players and this is why the Non-Masters Trophy is named for him.

Clarke-Cullinan STaC Trophy (formerly Clarke-Cullinan Consolation Cup): This trophy is awarded to the player who accumulates the most points during Unit 112 and District 4 STaC events.

The Clarke-Cullinan STaC was named after Truesdale "Bill" Clark and John Cullinan who were our first Unit 112 winners ever of an ACBL National Title and were nationally known players. They were both instrumental in setting up CNYBA in the early 1970's. Truesdale Clarke and John Cullinan are mentioned above with Ruby McKaig. Bill ran things in Rochester prior to the Unit taking over and putting Peter Pierce in to open it up. Bill, a lawyer, was born in 1905 and loved bridge. As a player, he had tremendous card sense and his many accomplishments earned him a place in the "Encyclopedia of Bridge". Bill is remembered as a dignified man with a sense of humor. He was well known for calling the "police" when he needed a director at his table. John Cullinan, also a lawyer, was from Oswego. He spent many years on the Board and ruled with a heavy hand!! The cup was donated by Earl Mancini of Ithaca who won about twelve straight consolation events and felt that there should be a trophy for that. In 2000, the Unit Board voted to change it to a STaC Trophy, reflecting the fact that we very rarely run qualifying open pairs events any more.

Second Place Trophies were established in January 1999. **Robert E. Cofer III**, a renowned bridge player from Ithaca, New York, donated moneys to be placed in a trust fund to honor the runners-up in the trophy races each year. Mr. Cofer unexpectedly passed away in January 2007.

Explanation of the Rainbow Sectional

The Rainbow Sectional (also originally known as the Master Pairs or the Treasurer's Tournament): The Master Pairs was one of the most prestigious tournaments in the country up until the 1960's. You needed an invitation to play and all the big names of the time would come to play. We then made it a sectional where you played in the main event if you had won a sectional event in the previous year or had over 1,000 masterpoints. The tournament dropped drastically in the 1960's so Gini Garrell came up with a name change and the Board approved the change. In this way no one was excluded from the main event. The Unit used to have a "rover" sectional. This was rotated around to various towns that would normally not have a sectional, such as Herkimer, Ogdensburg, etc. Several years ago, it was decided to make this tournament a special sectional and hold a variety of events that were not held at most sectionals, thus the name "**Rainbow**" for the spectrum of events. Over the years these special events did not draw, so it simply became another normal sectional.
