The New Laws: What Players and Directors Need to Know (submitted by Ed Reppert, Rochester)

Starting September 8, new laws will go into effect here (and throughout the world, although not necessarily on the same date). There are a few changes about which players should be aware, and a few more for directors. I'll try to cover both here quickly.

There was a decent article for players in the July Bulletin, but they missed a couple of points, so I'll go through everything here, using pretty much the same grouping of the laws the Bulletin did.

In general, there are still 93 laws, and they are still pretty much in the same order, each law covering the same subject as before. However, some things that were spread over several laws have been moved in an effort to put everything on a given topic in the same place. There have been some changes in terminology, as well. The term "convention" is no longer used, except in one or two places, and that may have been an oversight. There are no "sponsoring organizations" in the new laws, instead they're called "tournament organizers". There are now "Regulating Authorities" — the ACBL is ours. "Penalty" now refers solely to a procedural or disciplinary penalty. The term "rectification" refers to the remedies applied by the director when an irregularity occurs.

Laws 1-8 cover the preliminaries. There's only one change of interest here: we are required to shuffle our hands before putting them back in the board after play.

Laws 9-16 are the general laws on irregularities. One provision of Law 9 is not a change, but many people — including some directors — have formed a misconception of it, so I thought I'd mention it here. That is that dummy **is** allowed to call the director — provided that someone else called attention to the irregularity. I am told by Rick Beye (ACBL CTD) that dummy should also be permitted to call the director in case of a Zero Tolerance violation, even if no one has pointed out an irregularity. A significant change in Law 16 is that when a player makes unauthorized information (UI) available to his partner, such as by a break in tempo (BIT) or a question, answer to a question, or an alert (basically, anything that is not a call or play), players may now reserve their right to call the director later — they don't need to call right away. However, if the opponents disagree that there was UI, they should call the director immediately. When later a player believes an opponent who had a logical alternative may have made a call influenced by the UI, he should call the director at the end of the play.

Laws 17-22 govern correct procedure during the auction, with some entry into the play period in Law 20, which deals with review and explanation of the auction. Not many changes here, but some things bear repeating. You may not ask a question for partner's benefit. You may ask questions only at your turn to call (this means that if partner asks a question, you cannot ask a supplementary question until it's your turn). Any player may ask for a review of the bidding at his first turn to play (before he plays, so for the opening leader before he makes his — face down, remember! — lead). Declarer's first turn to play is from dummy. You should ask about the **entire** auction — asking about a single call may convey UI to partner. Law 22 now defines the time between the end of the auction (after the last pass) and the end of the auction period (when the opening lead is faced) as the "clarification period". This is when you ask questions about the auction, or for a review.

Laws 23-39 deal with irregularities. The significant changes here are in Laws 25 (Change of Call) and 27 (Insufficient Bid). Under Law 25, an unintended call (pulled the wrong card from the bidding box, for example) can be changed, as before, if done without pause for thought (from the time the player realizes he's made a call he didn't intend). However, one can no longer change a call that was not unintended. That call stands unless left hand opponent accepts an attempted substitution.

If you make an insufficient bid, you can still make it minimally sufficient in the same denomination without imposing restrictions on partner, provided both bids are not artificial. However, you can also change to a completely different call, or even if one or both bids in the same denomination are artificial, provided the meaning of the new call is completely encompassed in the meaning of the IB. For example, after (2NT)-2D, you can correct to 3D without barring partner, even though both diamond bids are artificial (assuming both bids are transfers to hearts). You may even be allowed to change your IB in 1C-(1S)-1H to a negative double! If someone brings attention to your IB, **take no action** (other than calling the director) until the director arrives.

Law 40 deals with partnership understandings. Things players need to know here: you may not vary your agreements based on a question, an answer to a question, or an irregularity, and you may consult your opponent's system (convention) card at your RHO's turn to call (so that you may know whether partner's call needs to be alerted, or how to properly explain partner's call). The Regulating Authority (the ACBL) may designate **any** partnership understanding as "special", and may then regulate as they see fit.

There are no significant changes in Laws 41-63. Law 64 (Procedure After Establishment of a Revoke) now

awards a two trick penalty only when the revoking player wins the revoke trick and the revoking side later wins another trick. Otherwise, it's a one trick penalty (there are cases in which there is no penalty, but those are unchanged from the current laws). Law 65 now specifically addresses pointing out that a player has a card turned wrong. Declarer may do so at any time; a defender or dummy may do so only until the lead to the next trick.

The remaining laws on irregularities during the play (66-71) contain nothing significant for players; there is some additional guidance for directors on adjudicating claims (Laws 68-70).

There are no significant changes for players in laws 72-91. Some parts of some of these laws have been moved to earlier laws, in order to keep pertinent information on a particular situation in one place. Reminder: when correcting partner's (presumed) misexplanation of your agreements, you should call the director before you do so (the declaring side before the opening lead is chosen, the defending side after play is completed).

Laws 92 and 93 deal with appeals. While currently an absent pair member is deemed to concur with an appeal, in the new laws both members of the pair must explicitly agree to the appeal. Law 93 deals with further appeals (after the appeals committee or CTD) and basically says (via a new ACBL regulation) that the appropriate body within the ACBL (the Laws Commission on a point of law, or the Appeals and Charges Committee in case of an allegation of bias on the part of an appeals committee member) will decide whether to hear any such appeal.

For directors, there's a couple of other things. In adjusting a score under law 12, more guidance has been provided on how to do it. The law clarifies that an assigned adjusted score is to be preferred if at all possible, but that the TD may award an artificial adjusted score even when a result was obtained at the table, if the possible outcomes are "numerous or not obvious". Note: **this is not a license to be lazy!** When a table result was obtained, an assigned adjusted score is your primary objective. An artificial adjusted score (average, average plus, and so on) should be awarded only as a last resort. The ACBL's election not to allow weighted score according to a number of possibilities remains in place. Law 16 also contains some new guidance, this time on dealing with UI. In particular, "A logical alternative action is one that, among the class of players in question and using the methods of the partnership, would

The ACBL has designated agreements to open at the one level (in a suit or in NT) with fewer than 8 HCP as "special partnership understandings" and banned them in ACBL events. Defenses to methods permitted on the MidChart or SuperChart may be referred to by any player at his turn to call. In adjudicating a claim, the TD may take into account any play subsequent to the claim. He does not accept any part of a defender's claim which depends on his partner choosing a particular play from among logical alternatives.
